2016 HIGHLIGHTS

Executive Directors' Letter Joan Mooney and Sheila Morris

ooking back over this last year makes us feel proud of what has been accomplished together. WCHS serves the community by being its reflection of the people, places, and events that happen over the years. It's the vitality of inviting visitors, making friends, and gaining members along with physical and financial support. Museum work is a lot of work! And the five part-time staffers and 15 board members cannot do it without you! So at this time, we thank you for another year of what makes living in a county community so rewarding and worthwhile. Our local history is important because it's ours—our stories, our memories—and

the touch point for our futures. This is where most of us started. This is where we have lived our lives. This is what happened to WCHS in 2016:

The Bailey-Lewer Library had a big year.

During 2016 our library finally got some upgrades. A very well-worn floor was refinished. Another Legacy grant funded a new digital microfilm reader-printer, funding for new efficient book shelves and library storage was reached, and to cap it off—Henry and Phyllis Lewer established the Bailey-Lewer Library Maintenance Fund to be sure his childhood home would be maintained for a long time to come.

The first year of the Timeline of Unique Stories, and the visitors come from everywhere.

We are quite aware that in order to maintain community support for WCHS, we had to earn it. Earn it with something to teach and entertain you at the

same time. Interestingly it has been the tourists and non-resident visitors who would stop in and ask, "What happened here?" The main floor exhibits varied on timely or seasonal themes, produced efficiently and affordably within the operating budget. But it had been a longtime goal to create a full timeline of Waseca County history from its beginning to the present. It was finally made possible with the passage of the Legacy Amendment, which provided for the Minnesota Arts & Cultural Heritage Grants program. A great deal of work went into obtaining match donations, working with exhibit consultants, and coordinating family histories and artifacts relating to the topics chosen.

The result was a permanent, state of the art unique exhi-

bition of Waseca County history from its beginnings in 1857 through the last decade 2000-2010. Indeed, we are requesting input from visitors now for events to add to the next panel, 2010-2020! What would you include?

The exhibit opened on October 8, 2015, and now we have completed a full year. Hundreds of people have experienced the exhibit, and it will serve as the basis for the county sixthgraders' Minnesota history studies when they visit in 2017. This first year we've let visitors browse without programming, but reading and embracing each topic at their leisure. Call it a "reconnaissance trip." We expect many return visits as friends

and family are in tow, remembering and asking questions. What is the broader historical context? Where is there more information about the topics and where do I find it? Learning by curiosity is a good idea. We will maintain these same stories, but eventually more unique stories will be created and begin to be replaced.

Where will we add them? If the museum space expanded, we could add more exhibits. If the museum expanded we could provide more programs for different ages, and volunteer educators.

There are as many reasons to support WCHS as there are stories in our past!



Three years of Herter exhibits

It was a story too big to do all in one year. It took more than one year for past employees and even family members to be able to talk about their Herter experiences. In the end all agreed that George Herter was a phenomenon that put Waseca on the map. Herter's should have continued to thrive. Herter fans and collectors couldn't get enough information, and

absolutely loved learning about Herter's life in Waseca in the third and final show. He was outrageous, clever, and passionate about the outdoors; and perhaps, may never be fully understood. Throughout the 2014-2016 exhibits, George Herter's story attracted visitors from all over the country. If Herter's store and catalog still existed in Waseca, it would continue to be the outdoorsmen's mecca.

Waldorf Exhibit was the biggest little exhibit ever!

The Waldorf exhibit was literally made possible by the personal collections and help from Clark Meyer, Judy Joecks, and Marty Tesch. WCHS staff needed only to set out the exhibit cases, and promote an opening event. Joecks had already self-

produced a book about the history of Waldorf. Meyer and Tesch had been collecting artifacts for years. Meyer had much of his collection already mounted on exhibit panels. Tesch loaned his pieces and helped write the exhibit labels. For our part, we invited the entire town of Waldorf, MN—and they came. There were several multi-generation groups of visitors, Waldorf/Pemberton High School reunions, officials, and young ones, but they visited every day during this very meaningful exhibit.

The Hofmann Honey Farm is a state and national treasure.

This beautiful and historical site finally achieved its National Register of Historic Places status officially in January of 2016. Since that date Joan Mooney has written more grant requests and started working with an Advisory Board to plan the next steps. At this writing the \$16,000 needed to proceed with Phase 1: Architects' Drawings for the Hofmann barn and wax shed restorations. The funding included a Legacy grant, a Waseca Area Foundation grant, and several local match donations. WCHS is the acting fiscal agent for the Hofmann Apiaries.


Finally, 2016 was a very unique year regarding memorable events and weather! Will these be added to future timeline panels, or be remembered with oral histories and photographs?

- 1) The April fire that destroyed the Tink Larson Baseball Field. It was arson. And it was apparent the morning after what a historical and meaningful place it had been for hundreds of players and fans during the last 50 years.
- 2) The 14-inch downpour last September 22 and the unprecedented flooding in Waseca and beyond. Hundreds of homes, families and businesses were affected. Furnaces, washers, dryers, furniture, and personal items had to be tossed. FEMA came in eventually. The rebuild and restorations will go on for some years.

With continuing support the Waseca County Historical Society will be here to help remember it all.
