Barbie, Queen of the Prom, Mattel ca. 1960

Put yourself in Barbie's shoes as she navigates the board fueled by the roll of the dice. In order to be crowned Prom Queen, Barbie must earn money for a prom dress, find a boyfriend, get a ring, become school club president and then she will be popular enough to win the crown. The Goldee Bears, A Honey of a Game, Gopher Game, Forest Lake MN. ca.1955

The little ones will enjoy creating character puzzles when the roll of the dice is in their favor. Not recommended for adults in a hurry.






Three Little Pigs, A SelRight Game, ca. 1959

Staff was not quite clear in their assessment of the game experience other than, too many steps and too

much color matching, however the colors are great and characters are cute. Selchow and Righter was a New York toy manufacturer better known for their games Scrabble and Parcheesi. Not recommended for adults who can't pay attention.



This game is based on the Disney cartoon film, Sleeping Beauty. The princes must find their way to the tower where they will find the sleeping beauty. The path is determined by the spinner which is loaded with detours, obstacles and danger. This one is adventurous as well as romantic.



Board games were a favorite find under the tree on Xmas morning. Maybe some of you remem-

ber Hands Down!, Mouse Trap, Candy Land, Chutes and Ladders, Booby Trap, Uncle Wiggly, Sorry, Life, Clue, the Match Game, and Concentration? Still popular today are, Ouija Board, Scrabble, Monopoly, Battleship, Operation, Twister, Chess and Checkers!
