The Mission of the Waseca County Historical Society is to collect, preserve, interpret and disseminate the history of our county and citizens and to create excitement and interest in our past.

From the Executive Director

Dear Waseca County Historical Society Members,

Regarding the year 2021: COVID-19 is still present. The pandemic has claimed more than 800,000 U.S. lives by mid December 2021. Also setting a record in December of 2020 and 2021 was the development and distribution of a vaccine. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines were readily available. By the end of 2021 more than 200 million Americans were fully vaccinated, setting a record for the fastest development and distribution of a vaccine in history. In Waseca County, as of September 2022, there are 6,015 total cases reported and 41 deaths. January 6, 2021, the insurrection of the United States Capitol unfolds in real time. The world witnesses a mob of pro Trump demonstrators violently storm the U.S. Capitol in the attempt to stop lawmakers from certifying the results of the 2020 presidential election of President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris.

Biden and Harris Inaugurated. On January 20, 2021 Joe Biden became the 46th president of the United States and Kamala Harris, the first female, Black and South Asian vice president. April, 2021, President Biden announces the withdrawal of American troops from Afghanistan. The last U.S. military forces left Afghanistan on August 30, 2021, 20 years after the 9/11 terrorist attacks.

On the rise in 2021: the escalation of violence, more school shootings and mass shootings taking place across America.

How this affects WCHS

We are collectors of history, not critics. Our focus is Waseca County History. History making events in 2020 and 2021 brought forth continuing challenges for many of us, impacting our lives economically, emotionally and socially. We are experiencing historic changes. The stories continue to unfold well into the current year. National and global events are well documented and archived for historic reference, not our role at WCHS. Collecting how the world activity affects Waseca County citizens, governance, economics and quality of life is important to WCHS. Acknowledging these unprecedented times, accurately reflects the present as well as the past. That is what we do at WCHS. The WCHS Bailey/Lewer Research Library houses public information files. The public is welcome to document life experiences and file them with WCHS. At WCHS we have documentation of challenging times in our history. We have, in recent past, pulled stories forward to acknowledge historic events that have impacted our lives. We reach out to our current populace through our newsletter and social media to capture personal experiences to better tell the story.

Going Forward

2021 marked the beginning of the end of the COVID-19 pandemic. Though still present, controls are now in place to manage the unprecedented spread of a deadly virus.

Governance and democracy are in the hands of those who vote. We can determine what defines us as Americans by exercising our right to vote. Once again, we are experiencing historic events and change.

Legacy Giving, a lasting Gift

Endowment Funds continue to give forever!

he heart of the ability to sustain funding over time is our family of endowment funds maintained by the Waseca Area Foundation. The Society has *seven* funds graciously initiated and contributed by generous members of WCHS and the Waseca County community. Our strategy is to keep building these funds to reach our goal of becoming a sustainable organization. If you believe in our mission, to maintain and interpret Waseca County history, you have an opportunity to leave a legacy in your name. Consider giving to one of the following funds, or talk to us about creating a new fund for your family legacy.

Nonprofit Endowment Funds are initiated by the Society with donated funds made directly to WCHS. The distribution from these funds is called *interest income*. A donation check is made payable to the *Waseca County Historical Society*.

Designated Endowment Funds are initiated by an individual's direct donation to an endowment—providing *grant income*. This donation check is made payable *Waseca Area Foundation* and is directed to one of these WCHS Endowments. Or, it is possible to create a new endowment fund with a minimum contribution of \$25,000.

THE WCHS NONPROFIT ENDOWMENTS

WCHS Lifetime Endowment Fund By board policy all Lifetime (\$1,000) Memberships are forwarded to this Fund created in 2008. All of our Lifetime Members understand the need for membership support and they do so with this commitment. Many continue to donate every year over and above this Lifetime Membership.

Frank and Barbara Goodspeed Memorial Fund This endowment was created in 2005 from a donation by Dorothy Moriarty in memory of her

beloved aunt and uncle. Frank Goodspeed was a native Wasecan and served on the first WCHS Board of Directors and for many years. Dorothy Moriarty left a substantial bequest to this fund at her death in March 2012.

Marvin and Ardis Sutter Fund NEW IN 2014 At the end of 2013 we had identified some significant needs in our nearly 100 year-old museum building. On January 3, 2014 we received a humble envelope with a handwritten note and a generous



check from the Sutter family of Blooming Grove Township. They asked

that we continue to preserve the history of Blooming Grove Twp., as well as the history of the Schuette, Saufferer and Sutter families; and in talking with Ardis Sutter, she said she had read about our museum building's needs . Half the donation was set aside for the roof replacement and half was directed to the Waseca Area Foundation to form the Marvin and Ardis Sutter Fund.

Ardis Sutter died on April 27, 2017.

Marvin Sutter passed away October 1, 2017.

THE WCHS DESIGNATED ENDOWMENTS

Edgar F. and Ethel Johnson Fund In 1923 Edgar and Ethel Johnson started a small business in their garage in Waseca that grew to become the E.F. Johnson Co., manufacturers of radio components,

CB radios, and forerunners of cellphone technology. It no longer exists, but during its time it won the coveted Navy "E" Award for WWII bond sales and radio service provided overseas. Edgar and Ethel, as well as Edgar's brothers Everett and Marvin and their wives, were proud of the company that employed so many in the Waseca area and cultivated a great work ethic and community pride. The Johnsons were especially supportive of the

Waseca County Historical Society by purchasing the present museum building, renovating, and donating it to the Society in 1964. The Edgar F. and Ethel Johnson Foundation was the first Waseca

Area Foundation Fund created to benefit WCHS.

WCHS Endowment Fund This endowment fund was created in 2000 by the Board of Directors and then Executive Director Margaret Sinn with a special anonymous donation. In 2014 this fund received a generous bequest by longtime board member, member, volunteer, supporter and good friend, Rod Searle, who died on January 5, 2014.

Jerry and Linda Rutledge Heritage Fund The Rutledges created this endowment fund in 2006, a statement of his continuous support for Waseca County history. Jerry is a native and lifelong resident of Waseca and retired CEO of Waseca Mutual Insurance Company. He served on the WCHS Board of Directors as President in 2008. During

his term as Board President, he led and challenged our membership and the community to participate in the first-ever WCHS capital campaign to celebrate Waseca County's 150th Anniversary. Not stopping there, also in 2008, Jerry and Linda announced a generous Charitable Remainder Trust that will eventually benefit WCHS.

Besides creating this endowment fund in 2007, Dr. Rethwill has sponsored events and donated many artifacts, photographs and an oral history. Dr. Rethwill died in June 2013.

501(c)(3) Charitable Organizations, History, Politics and the IRS

I would like to take this opportunity to share with members what the WCHS Board of Directors and Executive Director already know.

The IRS dictates how we behave as a charitable organization. We are in position to solicit donations from individuals, businesses, and organizations who support our mission (WCHS Mission Statement on the cover). Because your contributions are based on our mission, not the mission of other organizations, the WCHS Board of Directors created the following policy

June 13, 2018

Waseca County Historical Society Charitable Giving Policy Donations

The Waseca County Historical Society (WCHS) does not participate in monetary donations to organizations, businesses or individuals. WCHS can support other organizations and businesses by purchasing advertising space in promotional publications or donating items from the gift shop at the discretion of the Executive Director and Executive Committee.

Waseca County Historical Society Professional Membership Policy

The Waseca County Historical Society (WCHS) may join other organizations that reflect the WCHS Mission or are in place to support 501(c)(3) organizations or provide support and services to history related organizations.

The mission of the Waseca County Historical Society is to collect, preserve, interpret and disseminate the history of our county and citizens, and to create excitement and interest in our past.

Why is this relevant?

Though every year isn't an election year, you wouldn't know it as it seems the campaigning never ends! WCHS is by law, a nonpartisan organization.

IRS

Under the Internal Revenue Code, all section 501(c)(3) organizations are absolutely prohibited from directly or indirectly participating in, or intervening in, any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for elective public office.

This law does not pertain to staff, boards or members of a 501c3 organization. Individuals are free to support candidates of their choice on their own time during or after an election.

What About After the Election?

As referenced in the Director's letter, historic events take place in real time. After an election, the elected begins his/her service to the public. Activities associated with that service make up the history of the person serving the term. Unprecedented activities, good and bad, conducted during and after, make up the content of that service, which then becomes history.

Qualifiers

Discussions, events, etc. based on "things that really happened" or are happening in real time, are history or history in the making, not politics. Like it or not.


As dictated by the IRS

WCHS respects the rights of all individuals. We do not engage in lobbying for candidates or using the organization to advance or position candidates as dictated by the IRS.

How We Are Funded in 2021





We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, accountable to the state of Minnesota, the county communities, and especially the WCHS members all over the country. Although WCHS maintains a strong partnership with Waseca County, WCHS staff are not employees of the county. One of our goals is to be able to provide a living wage to staff in order to continue showcasing and preserving Waseca County History.

2021 Waseca County Annual Appropriation: \$67,500

The Waseca County Historical Society receives an annual appropriation from Waseca County. Over the years the funding has been applied to staff wages. Again, WCHS staff are not employees of the county. We are our own 501C3 organization. WCHS serves Waseca County residents, stores and preserves county records, pays for upkeep and insurance for county owned buildings like Hodgson Hall and the Bailey/Lewer Research Library.

2021 Township Annual Appropriations: \$2900, Cities: \$4500

Townships and cities appropriations are an important component of our annual operating budget.

We appreciate this support as we are here to serve all of our residents, not just the city of Waseca.

2021 Grants Unrestricted: \$ 37000

This category is for four of our (7)endowment funds that were established through the Waseca Area Foundation on our behalf.

2021 Endowment Income: \$ 21,750

This reflects the other three endowment funds that we initiated and brought to the Waseca Area Foundation. In total we received \$58825 for operations.

2021 Memorials: \$3360

Throughout the year Memorials are given to WCHS in remembrance of the loss of a special someone.

2021 Membership: \$14190

This income is generated by annual membership renewals, new memberships and new Lifetime Members.




